Gale H. Roid, Ph.D.

Dr. Roid is Dunn Professor of Educational and Psychological Assessment, Peabody College of Vanderbilt University, Nashville, Tennessee. Previously, he was Professor and Scholar in Residence, Simpson College and Graduate School, Redding, California. He was formerly Professor of Psychology, George Fox University, in the Graduate School of Clinical Psychology, 1993–1999. He was Senior Project Director for The Psychological Corporation®, where he was the initial project director and psychometric consultant for the *Wechsler Intelligence Scale for Children*®—Third Edition (*WISC-III*®) and related tests (*WIAT*®, *WPPSI-R*®, and *WAIS*®-III), 1987–1992. Previously, he was Director of Research for the test-publisher Western Psychological Services in Los Angeles, 1980–1985. He was an Assistant Professor of Psychology, McGill University, Montreal, Canada, 1969–1972.

In addition to his work in the field of psychological assessment, Dr. Roid has conducted research on educational measurement. He was a researcher and technical consultant for the Oregon Statewide Assessment in reading and mathematics, 1985–1990. He provided statistical assistance on IRT scaling and gave workshops to teachers on classroom performance assessment. He was a consultant to the U.S. Army Skill Qualification Testing program in the 1980s. He was Research Professor, Teaching Research Division of the Oregon State System of Higher Education at Western Oregon University, 1972–1979, where he obtained federal grants and published articles on criterion-referenced testing.

Dr. Roid is the author or co-author of six published tests including the *Stanford-Binet Intelligence Scales, Fifth Edition*, the *Merrill-Palmer Developmental Scale—Revised* (with J. Sampers), the *Leiter International Performance Scale—Revised* (with L. Miller), the *Toddler and Infant Motor Evaluation* (with L. Miller), the *Tennessee Self Concept Scale* (1988 manual with W. Fitts), and the *Structure of Intellect Learning Abilities Tests* (with M. and R. Meeker). He is co-author (with T. Haladyna) of the book, *A Technology of Test-Item Writing* (Academic Press, 1982). He has also authored seven book chapters, more than 20 research articles in refereed journals, and more than 50 refereed convention papers at APA, AERA, NCME, NASP, CEC, and other professional conferences. He has been a technical consultant, editor, and statistical analyst for over 40 published tests and manuals.

Dr. Roid earned his bachelor's degree from Harvard University in 1969, where he was a research assistant to David McClelland studying "need for achievement." He earned an M.A. and Ph.D. in psychological assessment from the University of Oregon in 1969. His doctoral chairman was Lewis R. Goldberg. He is a Fellow of Division 5, Evaluation, Measurement, and Statistics, of the American Psychological Association and was Secretary of that Division in 1998. He has been a Consulting Editor for the journals, *Psychological Assessment* and *Applied Measurement in Education*. He received a Diplomate by the American Board of Assessment Psychology in 1996.
